Page # 2 Welcome to the World of Speech

• Speech (officially called "Individual Events") consists of **14 different categories**, each different from the others. A student on the Speech Team may be in just one event ("single-entered") or may be in two events ("double-entered.") Most first-year members will be single-entered.

How do auditions work?

- You must come to D219 after school on either Wednesday September 25th or Thursday September 26th. These auditions go from 2:45 until 6:00 pm, though you may not have to stay the entire time. Get there early! If no one is around, we will go home. If you're new to the team, you <u>DO NOT</u> need to bring anything with you except the Audition form in this packet (signed by your parents/guardians) we'll give you everything else you need that afternoon; however, if you'd like to recite a <u>brief 1 minute</u> monologue or perform something you've practiced, we will give you that opportunity. Former Team members are **REQUIRED** to have a prepared audition piece.
- o If you cannot make it either day, you must email Coach Mehta at hemant mehta@ipsd.org. (And you better have a good excuse...)
- We will post the roster of who made the Team on Friday night, <u>September 27th</u>, on <u>NVSPEECH.COM</u>. Please check the site for further instructions that evening. If you make the team, you MUST make arrangements to be free Monday, September 30th from 2:45-4:00pm in D219. We'll have our first team meeting at that time and it's mandatory.

What is the commitment for Team Members?

The basics:

- We have tournaments every Saturday (all day) from November through February, minus the holidays. You are expected to be present at every tournament, whether or not you're competing – unless there is a conflict that the coaches have pre-approved.
- We have mandatory team meetings after school on Mondays (until 3:15). There will also be weekly Category Meetings, but the exact day will be decided after we pick the Team. You are expected to attend all of these -- unless there is a conflict that the coaches have pre-approved.
- Everyone is expected to practice at least one hour with their coaches or Category Leaders during the week – in addition to practicing by yourself at home. Outside practice is where real growth occurs. From experience, we can tell you that those who practice the most on their own are the most successful – a simple formula, really.

- There will be serious consequences for people who miss a certain number of scheduled team meetings and/or practices (without getting the OK from coaches). We understand emergencies happen, but we do not tolerate laziness or apathy. There are many students who will not make the team, so if you cannot live up to these expectations, please do not take away a spot from someone who wants to be here.
- You may not be on the Speech Team if you are planning to try out for or compete in a winter sport. If you are auditioning for the Freshmen One Acts or you are currently in the Fall Play, we'll work things out. Basically, your extracurricular schedule should be free from October through February.
- Yes, this is a lot of commitment. We know. Please audition only if you are willing to
 make time for us. In return, we will help you become a phenomenal public speaker and a
 strong writer/performer.

A few miscellaneous items

- O Those who have been on the team for more than one season are considered Varsity. If you're new to the team, we consider you Novices. Most competitions do not distinguish between the two levels. When the team is picked there will be 5 or 6 "strings" or spots in each category. We seek to put together the strongest team in every category experience and age do not necessarily guarantee that you are in the top two strings.
- O District 204 mandates that Team Members pay a \$200.00 dollar activity fee and complete a health form. These must be turned in before you are allowed to compete in a tournament. We are setting a deadline of Friday, October 11th to turn those in.
- o In every category, you either write or find the material you perform. Coaches or Category Leaders will help you with this. You are never alone and we want to help you succeed. For most events, you will (for the most part) keep that same script for the duration of the season.
- o If you make the team, we will do our best to put you in the event(s) you want to be in, but we always try to keep the categories balanced (5-6 strings each), and we decide which students will be in humorous/dramatic duets so if you try out with a partner, you may not be with that partner during the season. The needs of the Team mean you may not get in the category you want. But we will always put you in an event in which we think you'll do well and we're pretty good at noticing individual talent and strength!
- We are only interested in those individuals wishing to make the commitment to work towards excellence, realizing that success may not come immediately. Speech is an IHSA event, meaning all IHSA rules and regulations regarding the use of illegal substances and grades of team members during the season will be enforced and proper discipline will be taken. Also keep in mind that Speech is not a Club it is not a place for casual or occasional effort. We are a competitive, hardworking team. If you do not wish to make the commitment, please do not bother trying out for Speech. We have a tradition of success and we will do what it takes to continue that tradition!

FOR RETURNING MEMBERS ONLY: If you are interested in becoming a Category Leader this season, your responsibilities will be greatly increased. So read this over carefully. If you are still interested in being a Category Leader, please initial the appropriate box on *The Form* and complete the EXTENDED FORM (page 9). THIS IS DIFFERENT FROM PREVIOUS YEARS:

- Category Leaders are responsible for the coaching of the lower 2 or 3 strings in your category. You will also be running Category Rehearsals once a week with everyone in your event. Do not sign up to be a Category Leader unless you are willing to take on this responsibility.
- These responsibilities will not be taken lightly and captains and coaches will hold category leaders to their highest expectations. If the expectations are not met, the category leader will be excused from the position and a new team member will step up.

Page # 6 Speech Categories

- **Dramatic Duet Acting (DDA)** (8 minutes max) Two people act out a dramatic scene between two characters from a play. There are no props except a table and two chairs.
- **Dramatic Interpretation (DI)** (8 minutes max) One person presents a dramatic scene from a play (with two or three characters) or a monologue. There are no props. The performance stresses vocal variety and stance to differentiate among the characters.
- **Extemporaneous Speaking (ES)** (45-minute prep; 6 minute speak) After drawing 3 possible questions about politics/current events and choosing one of them to answer, you will have 45 minutes to prepare, "memorize," and then deliver a 6-minute speech answering the question. You must use citations from your own research to support your argument. (Sounds tough, but if you like politics, this is for you!)
- **Humorous Duet Acting (HDA)** (8 minutes max) Same as DDA, but humorous.
- **Humorous Interpretation (HI)** (8 minutes max) Same as DI, but humorous. You will likely play several characters, each with a different voice and posture.
- **Impromptu Speaking (IS)** (2-minute prep; 6-minute speak) After drawing three possible topics (like a word or quotation) and choosing one of them to talk about, you will get 2 minutes (Only TWO!) to plan out your speech. Immediately after that, you will deliver a 6-minute "memorized" speech about the topic. (Sounds tough, but we'll teach you the tricks to make it easier!)
- **Informative Speaking (Info)** (8 minutes max) One person presents an original informative speech about a topic the rest of us know little or nothing about. The speech must be researched and memorized.
- **Oratorical Declamation (OD or Dec)** (8 minutes max) One person presents a speech someone else has delivered in the past (like a commencement address or TED Talk). The speeches should be inspirational or thought-provoking in nature.
- **Original Oratory (OO)** (8 minutes max) One person presents an original persuasive speech about an important issue in today's world. The speech must be researched and memorized.
- **Original Comedy (OC)** (8 minutes max) Similar to Humorous Interpretation, except you write it yourself. You will perform a funny scene in which you play all the characters. Let your funny bone run wild!
- **Poetry Reading (PO)** (8 minutes max) One person "reads" a collection of several poems from various sources revolving around a particular theme.
- **Prose Reading (PR)** (8 minutes max) One person "reads" a single selection from a book/novel, drawing the audience into the story.
- **Radio Speaking (RS)** (45-minute prep; 5 minutes speak) The student is given a packet of "news." He or she then has 45 minutes to cut it and arrange it into a 5-minute news show including local, national, & international news, a commercial, sports and weather. It is performed in front of a microphone in a room separate from the judge. If the program goes under 4:50 or over 5:05 minutes, you're disqualified!
- **Special Occasion Speaking (SOS)** (8 minutes max) Similar to Original Oratory, except you can make it funny! One person presents an original persuasive speech about an important issue in today's world.

"So, like, how do I join the Speech Team?"

If, after reading all of this, you truly desire to be a part of the Speech Team for the 2013-2014 season here at Neuqua Valley, then you must follow these steps:

- 1) Go over the information here with your parents and return *The Form* (on the next page) to us during auditions On September 25 or 26th.
- 2) On Friday night, September 27th, check nvspeech.com to see if you made the team! Some time after 8 pm, the Team roster should be posted.
- 3) If you made the team (*Congratulations*!), there will be a mandatory team meeting the following Monday (September 30) in Room D219 at 2:45p.
- 4) Immediately make the necessary arrangements to free your schedule so that you may attend both the mandatory team meetings and all the required contests.

"So, like, what if this packet doesn't help me?"

There is no way you can completely understand Speech from the material in this packet, but don't panic. There is no reason for you to feel lost. After being on the team just a short time, you'll understand everything. If you want to join the Speech Team, no one will let you become hopelessly lost or fall between the cracks. The Coaches, Captains, and Category Leaders will look out for you until you gain a feel for how everything works. We know that right now you might be a bit overwhelmed by all that has been presented, but we assure you, you will soon get a handle on all that is happening. If you can make the commitment as described so far in this packet, then you can handle Speech and we will help you succeed.
